Hamilton Telehandler Training Courses - The employer has the responsibility to make sure that their workers are trained to work competently using telehandler machinery. The employees have to be assessed for their skill to make use of the machine. If deficiencies are found, employers should provide training so that employees obtain the necessary level of skill. The responsibility level of the person must be taken into consideration when training is offered. Effective training will solve any deficiencies in the skills, understanding and knowledge of telehandler operators and supervisors. Training can be undertaken by engaging the services of an external training provider or through in-house sessions. An assessment upon finishing the training period will determine if the learning objectives have been met or not.

Guidelines and regulations for the basic telehandler operator testing and training are set by local, federal and state/provincial regulators. Basic training does not deal with such subject matters as the lifting of suspended loads, the lifting of persons, the use of other attachments, or the operation of rotating machines. Further training should be undertaken if such tasks are required on the work site.

Maintenance and Inspection

Like any machine, a telehandler needs effective maintenance. The machinery inevitably would suffer wear eventually. Correct maintenance is vital to ensuring safe operation of the telehandler equipment. Checks and inspections are important to ongoing maintenance procedures. Operators have to have machine-specific training to be able to prevent, rectify and monitor problems connected with wear, deterioration and damage. Employees require competence and experience in both breakdown and periodic maintenance. The manufacturer's preventative maintenance instructions must be viewed seriously and complied with, taking into account such factors as environmental circumstances in the work setting and frequency of use.

The user of the machine along with the owner of the machinery share the responsibility for ensuring that the telehandler is in full working condition. Pre-use inspections are usually performed by the user, whereas general maintenance is usually carried out by the telehandler owner.
